In just a few short days, we will begin our 49th school year at NASA Goddard Child Development Center (GCDC). We are entering the year with pride and enthusiasm. We were able to accomplish so much last school year. Among those accomplishments we relaunched GCDC during a global pandemic, hired more qualified and credentialed staff, increased content instruction, addition of Physical Education instruction, revitalization of the parent committee, securing grant funding and improved communication practices.

In this edition of <u>The Lunchbox Press</u>, we introduce our dynamic GCDC's 2022-2023 staff. It is always better when you know just a little more about the person that educates and cares for your child each day. After reading the staff bios, we hope that you will have a better sense of our education, background, and philosophies.

If I could offer GCDC parents one piece of advice for the school year, it would be to become involved in your child's education at an early age. It is at this time that you teach your children how much you value their education. One of the best ways of going about this is to allow your child(ren) to see you involved in a variety of ways. Children are very literal people; they learn what is important by how we as adults invest our time. I encourage you to continue to invest time in your child's education for as long as they are students. This is one investment with a guaranteed payoff.

We are excited about the 2022-2023 school year and all that we have to offer your children. This is the best place for your children because we are equally focused on your child's care as well as their education.



Beginning in the 2022-2023 school year, parents must provide a minimum of ten hours of volunteer work, per family, per school year (September – August). Four hours must be completed by December 31, 2022. Four hours must be completed by June 30, 2023. Two hours must be completed by August 20, 2023. In addition to volunteering support to teachers in the classroom, parents may volunteer in other ways in support of the program.

<u>Volunteer Receipt:</u> No matter the type of volunteer work performed; parents are asked to complete a volunteer receipt each time volunteer services are performed at GCDC. Blank receipts can be retrieved from the check-in station at the front door. We ask that you do this even after you have met your ten-hour commitment. Completed and signed receipts should be turned in at the sign -n station located at the front door.

If the volunteer hours are not met, a fee will be assessed at a rate of \$25 per unmet volunteer hour.



#### FROM THE BUSINESS MANAGER

As we embark upon a new school year, we want to inform our new parents and remind our current parents of some GCDC policies.

- ★ All parents must clock their child in/out daily using the GCDC ProCare Engage App. All parents must download ProCare Engage to their cell phone. When families are within .25 of a mile to GCDC they will be able to complete the daily health screening questions and clock in/out.
- ★ GCDC hours are 8:00 a.m. 5:00 p.m. Parents who pick up their child(ren) after 5:00 p.m. will be charged a late pick-up fee.
- ★ Discussions with teachers are encouraged, however, they should be no longer than 2-3 minutes at drop off/pickup as teachers are still working in a ratio status. If a longer, deeper discussion is necessary please schedule a time to meet with your child's teacher that is convenient for you both. Please be conscientious and respectful of your teachers' time.
- ★ Accounts are billed Wednesday of each week. Payments are direct debited from your account on file by close of business each Wednesday. Declined payments will be assessed an overdue payment fee.
- ★ Many families participate in flexible spending accounts. If you need a statement, you can go to MyProCare (different from ProCare engage) through our website at <a href="www.gcdcnasa.org">www.gcdcnasa.org</a> to retrieve statements by dates requested. 
